

Alcohol & Drug Abuse Council for the Concho Valley

Program: Adult Treatment

The Alcohol & Drug Abuse Council for the Concho Valley provides substance abuse treatment for adult males and females who are mostly indigent, at times homeless, and who cannot afford private-pay treatment systems and facilities. Services provided include specialized female treatment services for pregnant women and women with children.



Boys & Girls Club - San Angelo

Program: Education and Career Development

The Education and Career Development program enables youth to become proficient in basic educational disciplines, set goals, explore careers, prepare for employment and embrace technology to achieve success in a career.

Children's Advocacy Center

Program: Hope House



The Hope House Program was developed to minimize the trauma that children may encounter during interviews following abuse allegation. Hope House conducts forensic interviews of child victims, provide therapy and social service referral, education and care management, court preparation support and case tracking to all victims and their non-offending family members.

Program: Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)

The CASA program provides children in crisis with a friend of the court, social service referrals and court preparation.



Children's Emergency Shelter

Program: Safe and Sound

Safe and Sound is based in a residential setting that provides a therapeutic environment 24 hours a day. Trained, professional staff assess the immediate needs of the children and develop a plan of service that will meet those needs. The primary need is for the children to feel that they are safe.

Concho Valley Home for Girls

Program: Connected by 25

A program developed to address the problems of young people who will transition into adulthood without the support of family. Youth that have been in foster care are released at age 18. This program assists these young adults as they learn to support themselves, to form healthy relationships, to participate in their community, and to have education opportunities in order to prepare them to manage the challenges they will face.



Galilee Community Development Corporation

Program: Helping Hands

This program is designed to repair and rehabilitate homes of low-income elderly in San Angelo. They will restore the homes to make them safe, secure and weatherproof. Volunteers will perform the rehabilitation, which is at no cost to the homeowner.

Concho Valley Regional Food Bank Program: Hunger Relief

Solicits, warehouses and distributes food

Texas Southwest Council, Boy Scouts of America Program: Nurturing Youth for Success through Cub Scouts

The Ozona Community Center Program: Cubbies Childcare & Little Lions Afterschool Care Program

This is the only childcare facility in Ozona that operates 12 months out of the year. It offers affordable, high quality daycare and pre-school while also influencing the lives of the children and families it serves.



Institute of Cognitive Development Family Shelter Program: Peace Begins at Home

The Institute of Cognitive Development Family Shelter provides the Peace Begins at Home Program to victims of domestic/family violence in the Concho Valley. The Family Shelter provides an immediate, safe place for victims to escape the violence.

This program is used to positively impact drop out prevention and targets ages 11-17. In addition to the existing Girl Scout curriculum, we utilize an alternate Girl Scout curriculum, Studio 2B, that is designed to attract this population of girls.
